July 1, 2019) had an indomitable spirit. She was a blessing who touched our lives and supported our profession. Leslie would do her best to ease another's burden. Leslie made this world sparkle and shine with her enthusiasm, passion, creativity and joy. Leslie craved for a life well lived and shared her strength, compassion and knowledge. She always left a place or a person better than she found them. At Leslie's funeral, the Rabbi said:
